#### **MINUTES**

## August 8, 2007 Veterinary Medical Licensing Board Meeting Minutes

Dr. Janet Small, President of the Ohio Veterinary Medical Licensing Board, called the August 8th, meeting to order at 8: 40 a.m. in the Board Room at 77 S. High Street, 31st Floor, Columbus, Ohio.

Call to Order

Dr. Small acknowledged the attendance of Theresa Stir, Executive Director, Attendance Staff, Donna Fickel, Executive Secretary, Barry McKew, AAG, Janet Buck, RVT, Linda AAG, and Guests Heidenreich, RVT, OAVT and Currie Crookston of PetDx.

Dr. Burt moved to accept the minutes as presented. Dr. Gitz seconded the motion. July 2007 The motion passed by the following roll call vote: Dr. Redman-aye; Mr. Smith-aye; Dr. Minutes approved Burt-aye; Dr. Gitz- aye; Dr. Koncal- aye; Ms. Jessen- aye.

There was no report from the OVMA liaison.

OVMA liaison

Theresa Stir, Executive Director, reported that the directives from the last board Exec. Dir. Report meeting had been completed.

Mr. Crookston was permitted to address the Board regarding the issue of the veterinary business facility license and the requirement for the supervising veterinarian to be an Ohio resident. This issue was recently before the Board when PetDx submitted its application for a veterinary business facility license. Mr. Crookston provided a brief overview of the business they provide and the fact that they were left suddenly stranded when their veterinarian resigned. Mr. Crookston was seeking a temporary solution to having an Ohio resident fulfill the obligation The Board explained that they had no authority to modify the law. Dr. Gitz explained the legislative process and that Mr.Crookston's solution remained with a change in the law. He encouraged Mr. Crookston to get in touch with the professional association, OVMA.

Ms. Stir had received a call from a physician of the OPEP (Board authorized Impaired program for impaired practitioners) with two issues:

**Practitioners** 

- 1) What is the Board's position regarding veterinarians working while on methadone while in the program? After some discussion, the Board determined that the OPEP physician's were the experts in that field who could determine whether the veterinarian was a competent practitioner while on methadone.
- 2) Is the OPEP practitioner required to report to the Board a veterinarian who lapses while in the program, even if the veterinarian entered the program voluntarily without the Board's knowledge? The answer is yes. Section 4741.31(H) of the Revised Code requires the reporting to the board of any veterinarian who suffers a relapse at any time during or following aftercare. It states that any veterinarian who enters into treatment by an approved treatment provider shall be deemed to have waived any confidentiality requirements..... The law does not distinguish between those who enter voluntarily or those who enter via agreement with the board.

Ms. Stir also informed the Board that the OPEP physician has agreed to provide an article for contact information, etc. for the Fall Newsletter. Ms. Stir will follow up with the OPEP physician.

Ms. Stir provided the Board members with information gathered from the State Medical Board Medical Board of Ohio regarding their oversight and disciplinary actions regarding medical records as well as their regulations on delegation of medical tasks. Additionally, Ms. Stir had been asked to provide information on which states regulated blood draws by animal aides. Ms. Stir reported that Arkansas was the only state that she had found so far that addressed animal aides' ability to draw blood which was permitted under the supervision of a veterinarian. No other state addresses in their state law or rules. Ms. Stir contacted the AAVSB who did not have an available response, but would try to garner information at the national conference in September.
